We encourage our Year 10 students to keep working and work to the best of their ability as the exams approach.

Marvellous Mathematicians

Year 7 are proving to be capable, dedicated and hard working mathematicians. No problem is too difficult and no competition too meaningless. Students have just completed work on angles, triangles and quadrilaterals. Throughout this topic students have been applying geometrical concepts through ICT, questions and hands on activities. As a class they have demonstrated the ability to reason through quite difficult concepts. The latest topic to be tackled is measurement. Estimation is proving to be a valuable skill and competition is rife between students vying for accuracy!

Year 10 are busily revising all course content ready for the upcoming exams. Algebra is

looking promising as is data. Further work needs to be undertaken on understanding financial maths.

Gamblers beware – Year 11 General Mathematics are on the case. Probability is the current topic leading in to a huge unit of work on financial mathematics. Students are currently applying the fundamental counting principle to a multitude of scenarios hoping to work out all the possible selections they could make from a restaurant menu.

Year 8 Maths

So far this term, Year 8 have been investigating the ways of collecting data. We have been busy

collecting different types of data through the use of both census and sample surveys. We have also briefly touched on the ways of analysing our data; firstly transferring the data into a frequency distribution table which helps us to justify the conclusion of the survey. These surveys have helped us come to many conclusions for example year 8 created a survey to find out how many students in secondary live in town or on a farm. This survey concluded that 62% of secondary students live on a farm and 38% of secondary students live in town.

In the upcoming weeks we will be learning other ways of analysing data through a variety of graphs and tables which will help us further analyse the collected data.

Yr 9 Maths

If you see a Year 9 student in the next couple of days ask to explain to you what **congruence** means or what the interior angle sum of a polygon is!!!

At the moment Year 9 is focusing on Deductive Geometry. Problem solving is paramount in this unit and the class is proving very adept. Year 9 has been working steadily so far this term in preparation for their end of year exams. There is a bit of rivalry for the top of the class with potentially five students in the running for the top spot. I wish all of them the best of luck in the upcoming exams and would encourage them to start revising their notes NOW.




VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS 2010

The Buzz on Breakfast

There is a reason that breakfast is called 'the most important meal of the day.' The first meal of the day is known as breakfast as it breaks the overnight fast. Eating breakfast can boost your child's metabolism and energy levels for the day. Foods commonly eaten at breakfast, such as healthy cereals like Weet-bix, untoasted muesli or wholegrain breads, tend to be high in fibre, folate and B group vitamins.

Compared to regular breakfast skippers, children who eat breakfast are more likely to be of a healthy weight, eat healthier foods throughout the day, are less likely to snack on unhealthy options, and have more nutritious diets overall.

Eating breakfast can also have a positive effect on your child's performance at school. Breakfast helps learning as your child is better able to pay attention. Increased attention may also have the benefit of decreasing naughty class behaviour too!

If time is a problem, a simple piece of fresh fruit and a tub of yoghurt will do the trick. You can also try making a fruit smoothie for your child to drink on the way to school.
