Some students have been busy completing VTAC applications and thinking through their options. It is important to consider a wide range of options and this sometimes requires one to think differently. With only two weeks remaining of school for Year Twelve it is imperative that students update their resumes, lodge all VTAC, UAC and SATAC applications, apply for special consideration, consider accommodation options, consider TAFE and other providers. Those hoping to gain employment should also be preparing and updating their portfolios to go with their resumes. Students should also practise their interviewing techniques, all of these things I can help you with, organise a time and visit the Careers Room.

Remember if you couldn't visit Universities/TAFEs on their Open Day you can organise to visit them at any time, Term Three holidays may be the perfect opportunity.

Year Twelve, concerned you may not get a high enough ATAR, what you can then do is complete the diploma of Tertiary Studies at Monash University in Arts, Business, Education, Information Technology, Nursing, Science or Media Arts. See pages 305, 316, 324, 328, 343, 347 of VTAC guide. Consider studying a related degree with a lower ATAR. You can then transfer (if you do well) to your desired degree later.

- Start with a TAFE course in a related field. Two years at TAFE often equals one year at University.
- Consider all country/rural campuses.
