Gold Level Silver plus an extra 30 Merits.

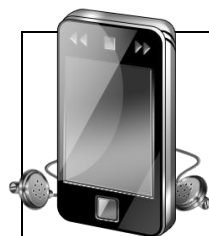

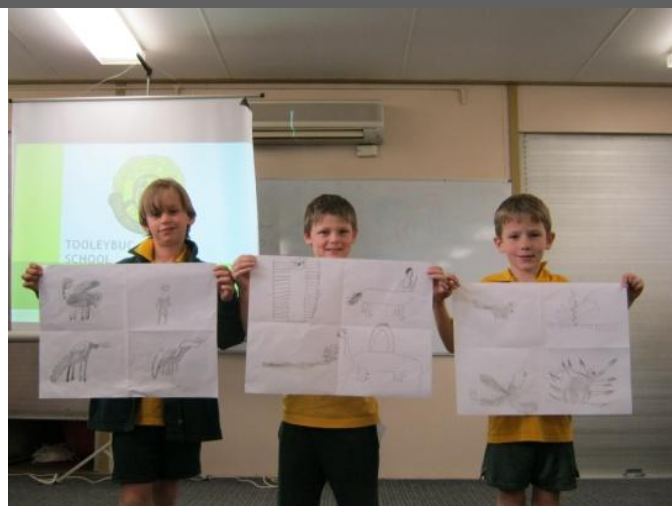

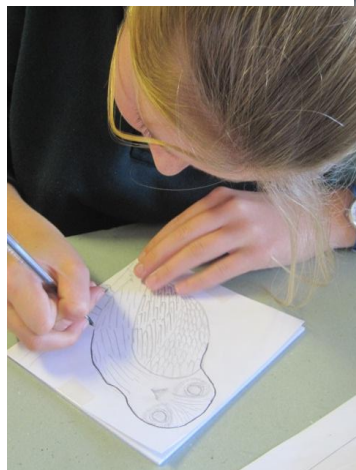

Year 4/5/6 News

Clever Climate

Students in Year 4/5/6 have been busy this term undertaking an integrated unit titled 'Climate Clever'. This unit explores renewable and non-renewable energy forms. Students have the opportunity to explore energy consumption using a PowerMate (see picture) and a Lux Meter which measures light (see picture). Students are in the process of conducting an energy audit of the school

and then deciding where energy cuts need to take place.

Discoveries with PowerMate

- Interactive whiteboards are very expensive to run when the projector is on. So when not in use teachers must turn it off.
- Turning off all computer monitors when not in use will save \$100 a year per monitor.

Discoveries with a Lux Meter

- If the sun is shining outside, pull up the blinds or open the curtains as this amount of light will be enough for a room. Saving the need to turn the light switch on.
- Most rooms only need a lux reading of 140 to be effective. Consider changing your globes to save electricity.

ADVICE FOR MEN TO GET FAMILY FIT

MENS HEALTH WEEK 13 – 19 JUNE 2011

Men across the region have been asked an important question this week: can you keep up with the family? Murrumbidgee Local Health Network is offering advice for men to stay fit and get the most out of family life as part of this years Men's Health Week.

“When men lose health it can impact on the whole family,” said Andrew Gow, Acting Director of Population Health.

“It's important that we keep in shape to get the most out of life, especially once we raise a family,” he said.

A review of men's eating habits across the region in 2008 showed on average only 1 in 10 men aged 16 and over were consuming the recommended daily intake of vegetables to maintain good health.

Mr Gow said staying in the habit of at least 30 minutes exercise three times a week and five serves of vegetables each day will make a dramatic improvement to men's health across the region.

Fathers who set a good example with a healthy lifestyle also tend to raise healthier sons.

A telephone coaching hotline is helping men to stay on track with ideas to lead a healthy lifestyle, and keep up with their children's sports and recreation activities. The Get Healthy Coaching Service offers free coaching to help men include healthy eating and physical activity into the daily routine and maintain a healthy weight.

Recipe: Vegetable Rice Paper Rolls**Ingredients:**

200 g rice vermicelli noodles
 1 carrot, peeled and cut into julienne
 1 daikon (Chinese or Japanese radish), cut into julienne
 1 cup bean sprouts
 1 cup shredded iceberg lettuce
 2 tablespoons hoisin sauce
 8 shiitake mushrooms, diced
 24 rice paper wrappers
 Black pepper
 24 fresh mint leaves

**Method:**

1. Cook rice vermicelli in simmering water for 2-3min, remove from heat and cool in cold water. Drain well and place in a mixing bowl. Add the carrot, daikon, bean sprouts, lettuce and shiitake mushrooms. Toss well and season with ground black pepper.
2. Place six rice paper wrappers in a bowl of water for about 15sec. Remove from bowl and place on tea towel without overlapping.
3. On a rice paper wrapper, place a tablespoon of vegetable mixture on the bottom quarter. Gently roll up to tightly enclose the filling, about halfway. Add a mint leaf and then fold the two sides in and continue to roll up completely. The mint leaf should be visible through the skin. Repeat the process for the other five wrappers.
4. Place the finished six rice paper rolls on a tray and cover with a damp cloth to avoid drying out. Repeat the whole process a further three times so as to have 24 completed rice paper rolls.
5. Serve with hoisin sauce.

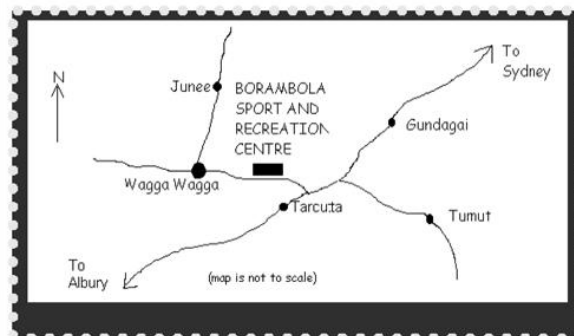

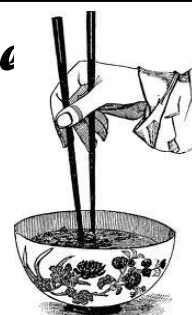
