Year 2-3

During the last two weeks, students have been engaged in reading a variety of short texts of different genres. Students have discussed these texts at length and have raised many questions about them.

Parent Tips

Next semester students in Year 4/5/6 will begin blogging with the Department's 'blogED' software.

The DET blogging tool - blogED

As part of its ongoing commitment to enhanced student learning outcomes through the use of technology the NSW Department of Education and Training (DET) has developed a blogging tool known as blogED. BlogED was developed in accordance with DET policies and guidelines and has incorporated feedback from students, teachers and parents.

Students access blogED through their DET student portal. When using the DET blog students are able to:

- use the same login they use for email and Internet browsing
- experience the same filters that are currently applied to the use of email and Internet browsing
- be guided by current permission forms regarding confidentiality and privacy
- be protected by DET standards of acceptable use of online communications.

What is a blog?

A blog (an abbreviation of weblog) is a personal website, organised like a diary or journal, which shows the author's most recent additions first. It enables the author to write regular entries expressing their view of events. Depending on the permission levels set for a blog, the readers (audience) of the blog are able to 'post' to a blog or 'comment' on a post. For some blogED types moderation is mandatory.

What is an educational blog?

An educational blog is an online journal where a student writes (makes posts) about their learning, which may be commented on by other students, the teacher or a wider audience as approved by the teacher. Students can add, link to or embed copyright compliant media such as photographs and videos to their blogs. DET blogs can only be set up by teachers. Teachers are able to moderate posts and comments on the blog.

Why use blogs in education?

Some of the main benefits of using blogs for teaching and learning are:

Engagement - students are familiar with online communication and are motivated to learn with online tools.

Audience - feedback adds authenticity to the learning activity. Students and teachers across all subject areas can find an appropriate and wider audience for their blogs. This may include at their choice, other students in the class or school, parents, students from other schools, and experts in the field from around the world.

Responsibility for learning – students are able to articulate their own learning in a blog and to strengthen a sense of ownership of the contents.

Learning communities - students and teachers can connect through their blogs, so they can read and comment on one another's understandings and opinions, and answer one another's questions, developing a network of support for learning.

Literacy skills - writing to communicate ideas, and integrating images and other media is integral to blogging.

Digital literacy - blogging combines technical and communication skills, which are entry level skills for most careers.

Critical literacy - students learn to evaluate and assess the credibility of what they read online, especially in other blogs.

Using a blog as a learning tool also makes it possible for parents to read and comment on their child's work (if the blog is made public). Blogs can allow parents to gain a deeper understanding of the explicit teaching and learning in which their child is engaged.

Subject Selections

Mathematics

The marvellous Mathematicians of Year Eight have had a productive term. Over the course of the term they have learnt about algebraic techniques, how to solve equations, ratio and revised angles. Throughout that time the students have demonstrated a commitment to the subject and enjoy engaging with different technologies. Over the term students have manipulated the animation making tool of Xtranormal, made a short film using Animoto and used Moodle to access interactive tools. The focus next term switches to measurement, a variety of topics will be studied including Pythagoras' Theorem, Circles and Area. Over the course of the term students will be using Edmodo to access their work. Edmodo is a social networking tool for schools and gives students the opportunity to engage in Mathematics in a collaborative way. I encourage all students in this class to continue regularly revising all work.

The students of Year Nine have accessed the different topics of algebra, rates, ratio and area. Students have been using their own Moodle site to help them engage with the content being studied. Students in this year should continue to access Mathletics to help improve their understanding of the topics being studied.

The students of Year Ten have been extensively using their own Moodle site to help develop their understanding across the term. Students have been given the opportunity to study topics of perimeter, area and volume, ratio and rates and

congruency and similarity. Students in Year 10 should ensure that they are regularly study all concepts and complete past School Certificate papers.

Our senior mathematicians have been working conscientiously across the term - they have studied a number of new and interesting topics and applied themselves diligently. Our Year 12 students need to make sure they are actively studying all topics and regularly completing past paper questions as they work toward the HSC.

Ancient History

Students in Year 12 have been working on Spartan Society and the Greek World to 500-440BC. Students have been working hard on analysing sources and developing their exam answering techniques. As a focus over the last couple of weeks students have been utilising the Edmodo site to help develop their historical understanding. Students should continue to develop their exam techniques by answering past papers and submitting them for feedback.

WASH YOUR HANDS TO AVOID GASTROENTERITIS

Murrumbidgee Local Health Network is warning people to take extra hygiene precautions to avoid gastroenteritis.

Infection Control Consultant Sharon Maher said gastroenteritis outbreaks tend to rise during winter and early spring.

"A number of different bugs can cause gastroenteritis but in winter it is often caused by a highly infectious viral strain which can affect millions of Australians," Ms Maher said.

The norovirus causes symptoms including nausea, vomiting, diarrhoea, fever, abdominal pain, headache and muscle aches.

"Viral gastroenteritis is highly infectious and is most often spread through direct contact with an infected person.

"The norovirus can also spread through indirect contact with contaminated surfaces, even through food prepared by a person who has the infection," she said.

Ms Maher said people who may have gastroenteritis should:

- delay visiting family and friends who are in hospital or aged care homes
- not prepare food for others until 48 hours after the symptoms have gone
- drink plenty of fluids to maintain hydration
- continue to wash their hands with soapy water before handling food and after using the toilet
- children should not attend school or childcare until 48 hours after the symptoms have gone

Symptoms of norovirus gastro can take a day or two to develop and usually last one to three days. The vomiting, diarrhoea, fever and loss of appetite can lead to dehydration, which needs immediate medical treatment.

HELP YOUR TOWN STAY ON ITS FEET WITH TAI CHI

Tai Chi is becoming increasingly popular across Australia and the world as a regular exercise to promote independent living and prevent falls.

The Murrumbidgee Local Health Network is recruiting an extra 20 volunteer leaders to improve access to Tai Chi locally.

Falls Prevention Coordinator Niccola Follett said the program has been a success for several years. "We have seen some amazing results from all ages as a result of the volunteer led classes," Ms Follett said. "Participants can gain stronger muscles and an improved sense of wellbeing, especially in communities where there are limited options for older people to participate in falls-safe activities," Ms Follett added.

Feedback from volunteer Tai Chi leaders has shown the benefits go beyond the participants.

Tai Chi leaders state the experience of volunteering as a leader of the program as rewarding and they encourage more people to do the same in their communities.

66 classes are held weekly throughout Murrumbidgee Local Health Network and it is hoped the new leaders will improve access in smaller communities.

Training for new leaders will be held on 19 - 21 August in Wagga Wagga at the subsidised cost of \$50 which covers the course, accommodation, meals and program resources.

WAKOOL ADOPTS BUDGET

Friday, 1st July 2011

Asset Management and development of the Local Environment Plan (LEP) are the key priorities of Wakool Shire Council's 2011/2012 Management Plan.

Council met on Monday in a Special Meeting to adopt the 2011/2012 Management Plan with a 'business as usual' approach adopted in preparation for the implementation of the new Integrated Planning and Reporting Framework in 2012.

'The 2011/2012 Management Plan reflects Council's focus on improving financial sustainability and asset management,' Wakool Shire General Manager, Bruce Graham said.

'The aim is to have sufficient working capital so that Council is in a position to implement Vision 2022, which is Council's long term strategic plan for Wakool Shire. Vision 2022 is being developed over this year with input from the Wakool Shire community, Councillors and Council staff and is part of the new planning process to be implemented from July 2012,' he said.

Mr Graham added whilst the Management Plan and Budget is predominately business as usual, there are several key projects and initiatives highlighted for the coming financial year.

'The development of Council's asset management plans is a big priority. It is most important that the Shire maintains its focus on the infrastructure renewal task – roads, bridges, halls, community facilities, and water & sewerage infrastructure – so that it can continue to provide these assets for the benefit of the Wakool Shire community,' he said.

'Equally, this budget reflects our focus on finalizing a strong Local Environmental Plan (LEP) that will facilitate development throughout the shire,' he said.

The Management Plan also confirms a continued investment into the rural road network including construction, sealing, maintenance and vegetation control.

'Wakool Shire has a large road and bridge network, so it is important to focus on the maintenance and upgrade of this key infrastructure,' Mr Graham said.

The program of works and general service provisions in the Management Plan are based on a rate revenue increase of 2.8 percent in accordance with the State government's rate peg.
