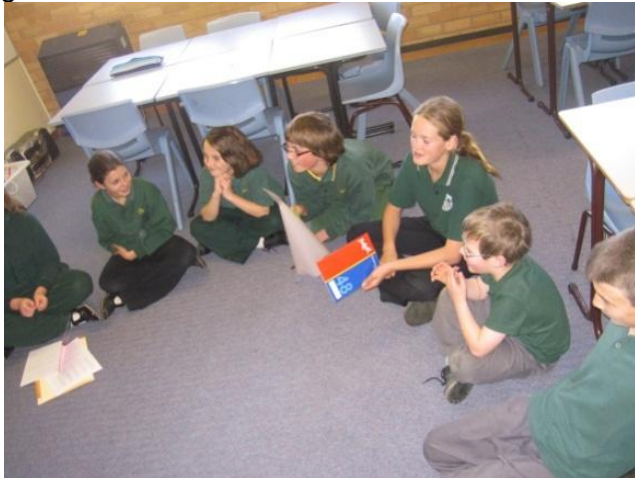

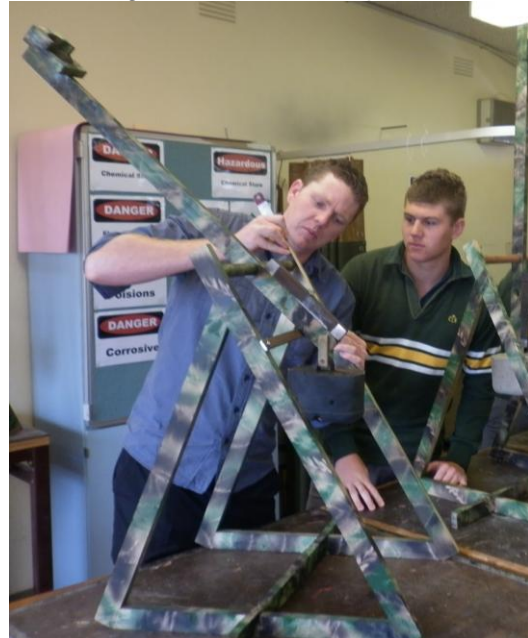
Design & Technology

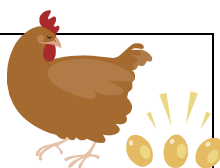
