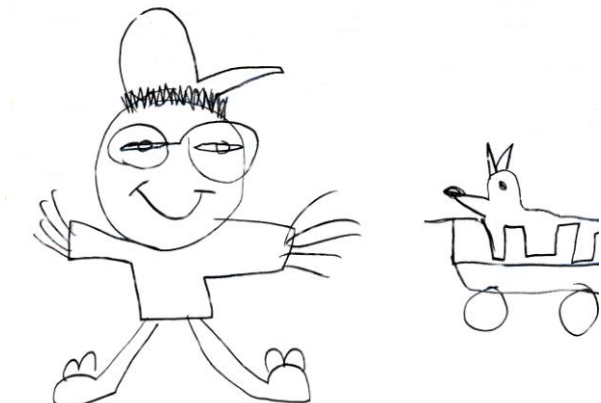

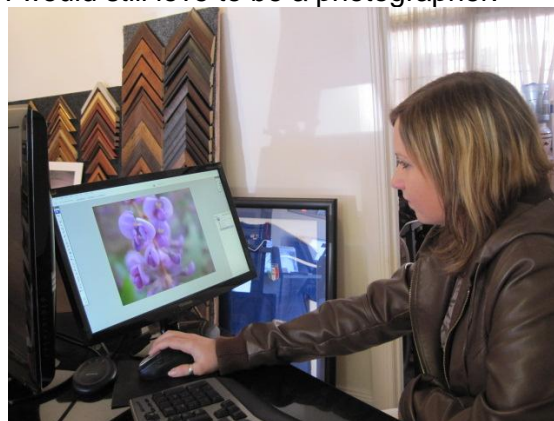

For my Work Experience at the Swan Hill Rural Council in the IT department. I had fun and hope to get a job in the IT area but in a higher position.

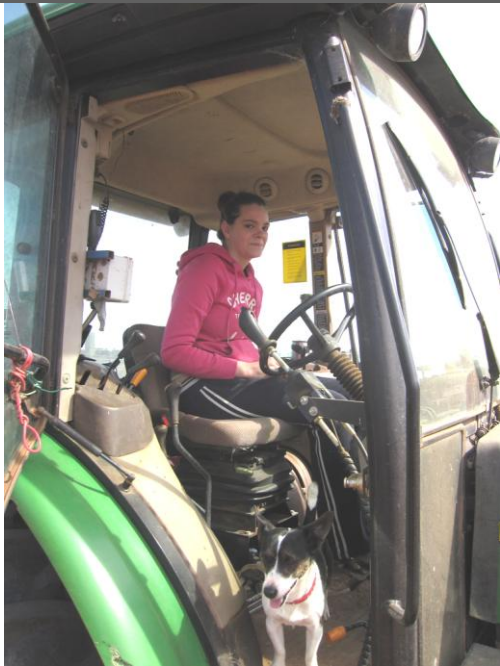

People with asthma should use a preventer medication each day and carry a reliever medication, such as Ventolin to help to reduce breathing problems when needed.

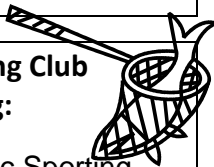
