During this program students will participate in a range of activities designed to prepare them and support their learning in the 2013 school year. These activities will include diagnostic testing and support in literacy and numeracy, study skills, physical activity and a creative arts program including the making of a mural.

Year 10 Organisation

At the beginning of Week Six our Year 10 students will 'roll over' into their Stage Six (Year 11 program of study) they must however complete a number of things prior to the commencement of this course, these activities include 'All My Own Work' which is a program designed by the Board of Studies to help them to prepare for the expectations of HSC study and covers issues such as plagiarism. Students will undertake this program during Week 5 when they aren't participating in exams.

Year 7 - 10 Exams

Year 7 - 10 will participate in exams in their core areas, English, Maths, Science, HSIE and PDHPE during Week 5. Students will receive a timetable for these exams in the near future. Students should already be revising for their exams and creating summaries of their notes to help them prepare.



Fairfax



Stuvac, HSC Exams and Junior Exams

As our HSC students commence Stuvac (Study Period) this week, parents and students are reminded that HSC teachers are still available for contact at the school to go over any concerns that arise for students in the course of their HSC exam preparation. Junior students will be having their examinations in Week Five, and as part of the school's Literacy Strategy, Summarising will be a focus skill for Term 4. When summarising, students need to focus not only on facts or methods, but also concepts or ideas they have learned in each of their courses. Rather than just remembering a fact, it is often more helpful to ask



a studying student, 'What does this fact help to prove?' or 'What can you do with this skill?'

Science

David Giles (Science Teacher)

Year 9/10 are studying a physics unit at the moment. This involves building models that are wind, solar and electrically powered. They will be required to explain how they work. The students will then do measurements to calculate the speed of their vehicles. I hope we will be able to move on to robotic controlled models. They will also be studying electricity and electrical circuits. These circuits can now be constructed on iPad applications which test them.

Year 8 will be doing ESSA tests soon. They have been doing practice sessions online. They have been studying Ecology in class. This involves looking at the environment and looking at all the organisms and their place in the web of life. We studied how plants and animals are adapted to the place in which they live.

Year 7 have finished a unit of work on classification and living things. This involved looking at plants and animals and using classification keys. We have now started a new unit called dynamic earth. This involves looking at the structure of the earth and the different types of rocks and minerals that make it up.

Ag Plot

The Agriculture plot would like donations of fencing materials i.e.: star pickets, strainer posts, ringlock, gates or barb wire. If you have any spare the school would appreciate your consideration.

The school will be completing a mural in Term 4 and we will require CDs and old LP records. If you have any that you no longer require could you please donate them to the front office.



Just as physical first aid can save the life of an injured person, Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) can be life saving for a person suffering a mental illness. MHFA is the help provided to a person developing a mental health problem or in a mental health crisis. Mental Health problems covered include:

- Depression
- Anxiety disorders
- Psychotic disorders
- Substance Use disorder
- Eating Disorders(YMHFA)
- Non suicidal Self Injury (Self Harm).

Participants learn the signs and symptoms of these mental health problems, where and how to get help and what sort of help has been shown by research to be effective.

Youth Mental Health First Aid (YMHFA)

Participants will learn about adolescent's development and the signs and symptoms of mental health problems, where to get help and what sort of help is shown by research to be effective. The mental health problems addressed include depression, anxiety, eating disorders, and psychosis and substance misuse.




