### Year Five/Six

As the term moves on, students are gaining a more in depth understanding of the topic War and in particular the area that they have chosen to research as part of their major project. Towards the end of the term you will receive an invitation to attend an open session at school where you will be able to come in and your child will present to you what they have been working on for the last 3 weeks. We certainly hope that you will be able to attend and as soon as final plans have been created we will send out the invitations.

To help support the students' learning with this topic an excursion to Melbourne to visit the Shrine of Remembrance and to attempt to climb the '1000 Step Kokoda Memorial Walk' has been organised. Please fill out and return the paperwork and payment to the school as soon as possible.

Over the last fortnight we have been focusing on two key concepts in literacy sessions, inferred meaning and writing fat and juicy sentences. Inferred meaning has involved reading and creating meaning from poems written about war by 'reading between the lines' and searching for clues as to what the author actually means but is not exactly saying. This has involved a lot of discussion between small groups and the whole class and it has been wonderful to see how many students have improved in their ability to interpret a text and understand the hidden messages that the author is trying to get across.

As part of this we have been examining the students role as an author to create movies in their readers minds by ensuring that they are showing and not telling. We have called this technique making 'Fat Juicy Sentences'. By students starting to use this technique the quality of their writing has really improved. Check out some of the students work samples below.

### Fat juicy sentences

## Dietetics, Swan Hill District

### Nutritious after school snacks

Children often need snacks after a busy day at school. Since snacks can be an important part of a child's diet it is important to make them nutritious. Here are some ideas for easy and nutritious snacks:

- Carrot or celery sticks with peanut butter
- Fresh, canned or dried fruit
- Low fat yoghurt or custard
- Glass of low fat milk, plain or with milo
- Sandwich, with salad fillings
- Crumpets, english muffins or toast with low fat toppings and/or low fat cheese
- Plain popcorn

### Do children need supplements?

If children are eating a well balanced diet, which includes foods from all food groups then they should be receiving all the nutrients that their growing bodies need, and shouldn't need nutrition supplements. Supplements are not a substitute for a well balanced diet. Foods contain a large range of nutrients that cannot be substituted by supplements. Offer your child a variety of foods that they will eat and they are likely to be meeting all their nutrient needs. If you are concerned that your child is not getting sufficient nutrients see your doctor or dietician.

### Too sick to go to school?

Sometimes it's hard to know if your child is really coming down with something or just suffering a bout of Mondayitis. This chart will help answer your questions about common childhood illness and how long sick kids need to miss school.

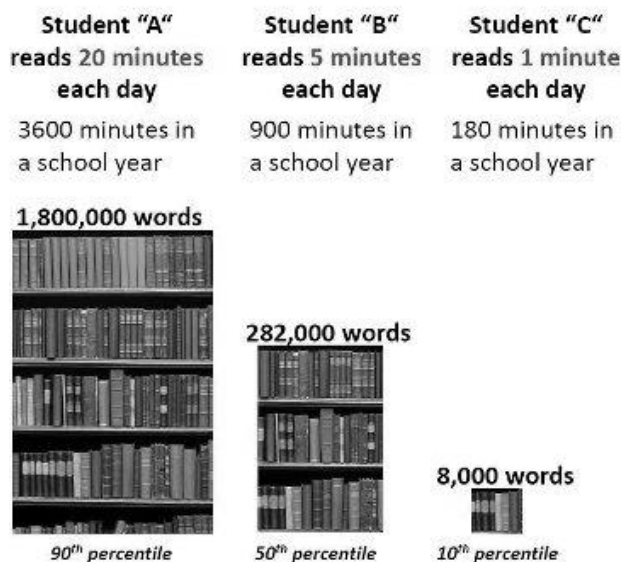

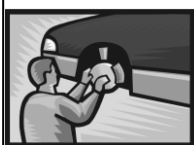
