During Term Two, Kindergarten has been involved in many great learning activities. In Science we have planted potatoes and peas in our new vegetable beds. The class is very keen to see the new plants emerging from the soil.

Students have continued to be involved in the Peer Tutoring program, involving the Year 3 and 4 students reading with the Kindergarten students. This program is hugely successful with Kindergarten students enjoying the opportunity to demonstrate their growing reading skills and the Year Three and Four students consistently conducting themselves in a very responsible manner and providing a meaningful experience for all participants.

Kindergarten has been focusing on Dinosaurs in Visual Arts. Recently students created models of imagined dinosaurs and sketched their creations.

Secondary News

Bruce Nield (Head Teacher)

How2Learn Conference

Myself and Ms. Rutherford had the opportunity to attend the How2Learn conference last Thursday and Friday in Wagga Wagga. This looked at recent research into improving educational outcomes and how schools create a 21st century learner for the modern workplace. Our school is beginning to explicitly implement the habits explored in this course that lead to more successful learning, beginning with managing distractions.

How2Learn – Managing Distractions

The traditional approach to managing distractions misses one key idea – how do you know when you've become distracted? In a 21st century learning environment where students are often completing learning activities on topics of their own interest, learning without writing or working in groups, students are often confused as the old 'sit down, shut up and do your work' attitude doesn't really work for a modern collaborative workplace that we are training students to enter.

This week students in Years 5 to 8 have been introduced of a five point scale to enable them to measure and reflect the level of distractions they are experiencing (or creating). They also have looked how giving into distractions over time leads to a cycle of behaviour where being distracted leads to a lower quality of learning and less interest in it. We then compared this to a cycle of success and how by avoiding distractions the quality of and feeling towards learning products improved.

7/8 History

Bruce Nield (Teacher)

This term students investigated Easter Island with a focus on sustainability. In looking at the decline of this civilisation, students examined what happens when a group of people run out of the resources we need and reflected resource use in our own context.

Students have now begun a study of the Black Death in Europe, Asia and Africa. The spread of disease, the need for hygiene and how the medieval world understood the pandemic are being explored. This topic will be followed next term by a study of Renaissance Italy and how this dynamic period of human civilisation led to the modern scientific age.

9/10 History

Bruce Nield (Teacher)

This term in History students have continued with their study of India from 1750 to 1918. Students

completed an ICT Collage with Harry H in particular doing an excellent online 'Prezi' presentation. Students are now moving on to a detailed study of the Industrial Revolution. As part of rewarding students for their commitment to learning, these students have been allowed to select an area of this time period as special focus. They have chosen the everyday life of people in Britain during the Industrial Revolution as an area they would like to spend more time learning about.

Year 7/8 Geography

Anna Martin (Teacher)

Year 7 and 8 have been on a Polar exploration this term, with a particular focus on Antarctica and the Emperor Penguins. We have discovered many interesting facts such as; Emperor Penguins are the only living animal that inhabits Antarctica, Antarctica is a desert and penguins waddle because they have no knee joints! Next term we will be studying the coastal fringe of our beautiful country.

Year 9/10 Geography

Leeta Rutherford (Teacher)

This term has seen the 9 & 10 Geography students focusing mainly on natural disasters in Australia. One assessment task involved the students choosing a natural disaster, researching it and then creating a special newspaper based on the disaster as if it had occurred in this district.

The following is part of one article written by a student:

'The Effects a Bushfire would have on Tooleybuc' written by Billy

If a large bushfire came through the Tooleybuc region, it would have a great upset on the community. The reason for this is because of all the food being produced in this area. Not just the food but all the natural habitats that are in the area. This area has a lot of food being produced and having a large bushfire would destroy all the farms making a large upset to the economy.

On Wednesday and Thursday (12th & 13th of June 2013) students from Year 5 to Year 9 were given the opportunity to work with Alexandra Knox. Alexandra is a contemporary dancer from Adelaide.

We were very fortunate to have Alexandra in our school, she has a solid body of training and has travelled all over the world working with different troupes and performers.

Alexandra worked with the students to create engaging, unique and thought-provoking dances to be performed on Performance Night on the 21st of August 2013.

Students were introduced to a new style of dance, one that brought out the individual qualities of each student, using moves created by the students and piecing the together in a unique and dynamic fashion.

Alexandra will be back during the first week of Term 3 to polish all the dances.

Schoolkids Bonus

The Schoolkids Bonus, a twice yearly payment to help lighten the load of school costs. The instalment was paid in January.

The second instalment of the Schoolkids Bonus will be paid in July and eligible families who have not updated their child's education details with Centrelink have until 29 June to do so to ensure they receive the correct payment in July. Eligible families who have updated their child's education details with Centrelink do not have to do anything.

This means eligible families will have extra money on hand to help with mid-year and ongoing education expenses, like school excursions, winter uniforms, new stationery and other school supplies.

We also have a range of information materials, including:

- an information brochure and factsheet (in English and ten languages)
- a pathfinder to help families understand if they are eligible for the Schoolkids Bonus
