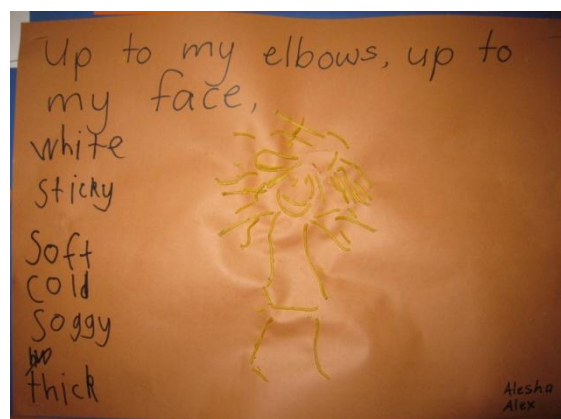
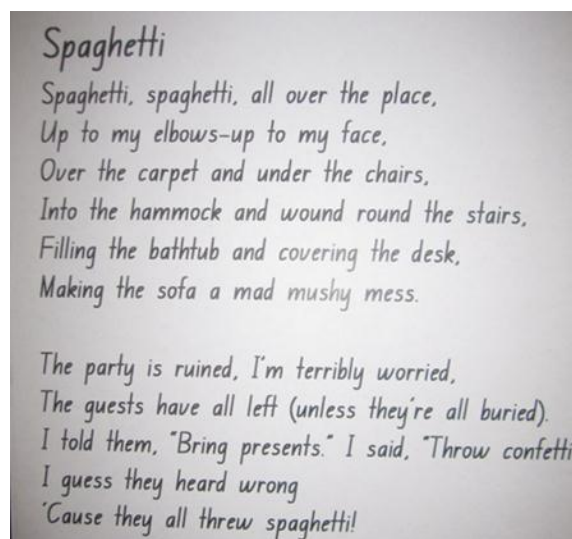
Year One/Two

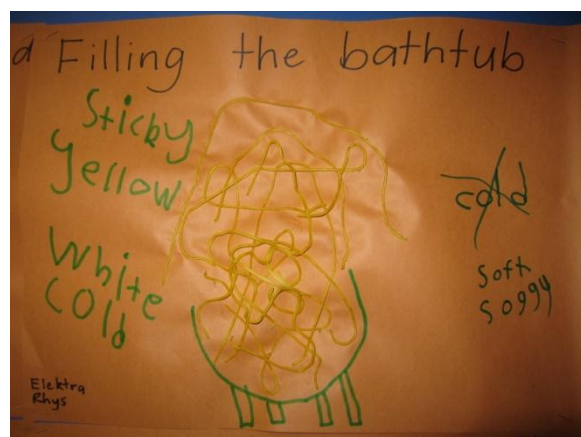
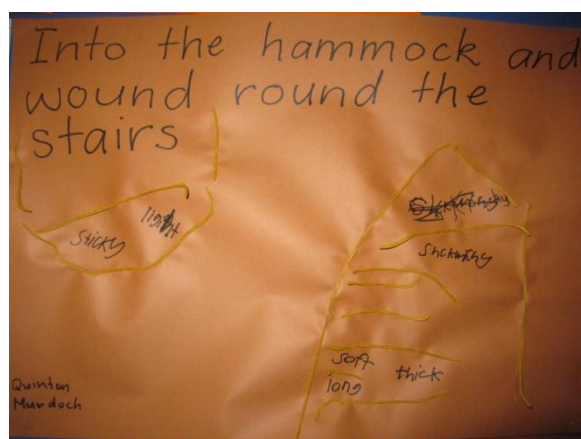

Youth Leading the World

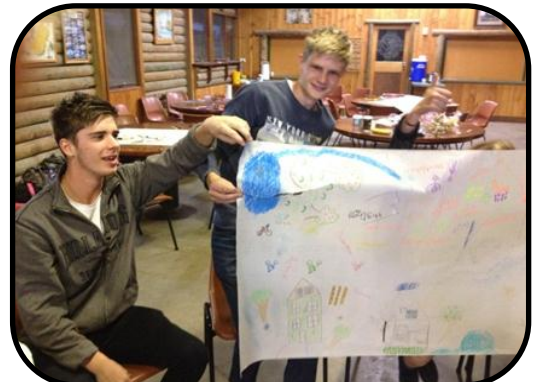

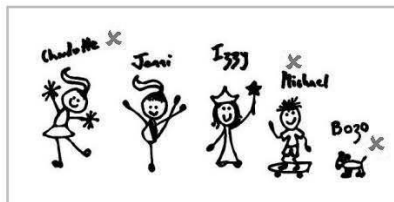
