### Year 7 TAS Mandatory





Year 9 students have completed projects including a simple tool box and bird house. They are currently constructing a condiments picnic table. Year 10 students have made a simple tool box or a cutting board. They are currently working on a tissue box cover.

### Year 9 Industrial Technology Farm Maintenance David McCarron (TAS Teacher)

Year 9 Industrial Technology Farm Maintenance students have spent 1<sup>st</sup> term identifying and treating farm pests. This has involved practical work with poultry, sheep and pastures as well as carrying out routine farm maintenance activities. This term we have started a unit on bicycles. A number of bicycles have been obtained by the school. Students have been busy making a bicycle workshop and have commenced some maintenance. At a later date these be will be used by other students for sporting or recreational activities.

### Stage 6 Primary Industries

Stage 6 Primary Industries have now completed their Preliminary Course. During this time they have commenced a number of units of competence including tractor operation and fencing. All students have now constructed a fence from scratch on the top block at the school farm. This will enable us to carry out livestock activities on this area in the future. This week students have been involved in sowing wheat and oats. If we get enough rain we will be making hay later in the year. Later this term students will be

involved in lamb marking activities on a number of farms. All students have also successfully completed a one week of mandatory Work Placement.

**Food Technology Year 9/10****Janine Nelson (Class Teacher)**

The soufflé is a dish that calls for only a handful of ingredients, making it appear to be simple. But it requires just the right amount of whipping and folding of egg whites to work. This week, students in Years 9 & 10 prepared 'Orange soufflé served with stirred vanilla custard and meringue signatures'.

Students were careful to not let any yolk in their egg whites. Just the tiniest bit can hinder your whites from properly rising.

During the lesson our students' learnt to be conscious while folding the ingredients. Folding egg whites into a custard is not like mixing up pancake batter. You want to be a little more gentle. Our Food Technologists learnt the best way to do this is to push the egg whites gently down and pull the heavier custard up in a sort of S shape trying not to over mix. The results were delicious.

**Year 9/10 Child Studies Course****Kim Morton (Class Teacher)**

As part of the Child Studies class students are studying Parenting and Newborn Care. With this unit students get to care for a 'simulation baby' (doll) for three nights and days. This involves them feeding, burping, settling, changing nappies and providing attention at unknown times throughout the day and night. They also have to organise babysitters for the times they can't care for their 'baby'.

We've only had the babies for one night and it was frustrating. It's very tiring and they always seem to cry at the wrong time. It's a good insight to being a mother, which we won't be for a while!

**MELBOURNE COURSES MOST POPULAR** - The University of Melbourne offered more than 7500 students a place in an undergraduate course for 2015. The **Bachelor of Science** remains the largest and most popular undergraduate course in the state, with 2518 students offered a place. The **B. Arts** (1286) offers and **B. Commerce** (1150) also saw growth in offer numbers. The Clearly-In ATAR for

Science was 86.00, for Commerce it was 95.00, for Arts it was 90.05, for Biomedicine it was 98.85 and for Environments it was 85.00.

**2016 NURSING PREREQUISITES** – Prerequisites for the La Trobe B. Nursing have changed for 2016. They are: 3/4 English (at least 30 in EAL or 25 in any other English) and at least 20 in one of biology, chemistry, health and human development, any maths, physical education, physics or psychology.

**2016 OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY PREREQUISITE CLARIFICATION** – There has been confusion about the wording of the requirements. They are: Units 3/4 English (at least 30 in EAL or at least 25 in any other English), and at least 25 in one of biology, chemistry, any maths, physical education or physics.

**ELITE ATHLETE BONUS ENTRY SCHEME** – La Trobe University offers bonus aggregate points for elite athletes. The Scheme is available to domestic undergraduate applicants: who are classified as an elite athlete, whose sporting commitments have impacted on their previous studies, and who applies for admission to courses via the Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC). **DEAKIN UNIVERSITY AND NAVITAS REBRAND PATHWAY COLLEGE** – Deakin University and leading education provider Navitas have announced plans to extend their partnership by renaming the pathway college, the Melbourne Institute of Business and Technology (MIBT), to Deakin College. Through MIBT, Navitas has collaborated with Deakin University since 1996, providing pathway courses for both domestic and international students.
