## Secondary News

### Mr Hocking (Head Teacher)

It's "squeaky backside time", as Sir Alex Ferguson might say – time for our Stage 6 students to be on top of their game as they sit their HSC exams. This will represent the culmination of their 13 years of schooling, and we wish them all the best at this time. But it's not just the Stage 6 students – all students from Year 7 to Year 10 will be having exams in Week 5. Time to get revising!

Next year's Stage 6 students will soon be travelling to explore their options for tertiary institutions in Ballarat and Bendigo. We will be visiting Federation University, Australian Catholic University, La Trobe University and Bendigo TAFE. This will mark a great opportunity for these students to see what opportunities await them after they finish school.

The rollover into the next academic year begins in Week 6. Students will move up a year level and begin their studies anew. Any combined classes at Stage 5 (such as electives) will be run as they will run next year. Year 7s will move into Year 8. Any combined Year 7/8 classes will only have Year 8s until next year.

### Mathematics

#### Mr Hocking (Mathematics Teacher)

This week, parents, you're getting homework! Here's a puzzle for you to work through with your students. You can solve it by hand and actually flipping the coins, or by using technology such as a spreadsheet, but here is the scenario: You place 25 coins heads up in a row and number them by position, with the coin all the way on the left No. 1 and the one on the rightmost edge No. 25. Next, for every number N, from 1 to 100, you flip over every coin whose position is a multiple of N. For example, first you'll flip over all the coins, because every number is a multiple of 1. Then you'll flip over all the even-numbered coins, because they're multiples of 2. Then you'll flip coins No. 3, 6, 9, 12 ... And so on.

What do the coins look like when you're done?  
What do the coins showing tails have in common?

## MOSQUITOES ARE A HEALTH HAZARD

Mosquito numbers are likely to increase rapidly during flooding, warns Murrumbidgee Local Health District.

"Mosquito bites are not just a nuisance, they also have the potential to pass on disease," said Director Public Health Tracey Oakman.

"People should avoid being bitten by mosquitoes to avoid contracting common mosquito-borne diseases such as Ross River Virus and Barmah Forrest Virus," she said.

Tips to avoid being bitten include:

- Cover up as much as possible when outside with light-coloured, loose-fitting clothing and covered footwear.
- Use an effective repellent on all exposed skin. Re-apply repellent within a few hours, as protection wears off from perspiration, particularly on hot nights. The best mosquito repellents contain Diethyl Toluamide (DEET) or Picaridin.
- The stronger the concentration of an insect repellent, the less frequently it will need to be applied to stop mosquito bites. Repellents containing low concentrations of DEET or Picaridin provide shorter periods of protection so it's important to read the product information.
- Topical repellents are not recommended for use on children under three months of age. Use of physical barriers such as netting of prams, cots and play areas is preferred.
- Repellents containing less than 10 per cent DEET or Picaridin are safe for older children if applied according instructions.
- Light mosquito coils or use vaporising mats indoors. Devices that use light to attract and electrocute insects are **not effective**.

To reduce the risk of mosquitoes around the home:

- Cover all windows, doors, vents and other entrances with insect screens.
- Consider also using a surface insecticide spray in areas where mosquitoes like to rest. During the day, mosquitoes rest and hide in cool shady areas such as in and around the home before emerging at dusk to feed.
- Cleaning up your backyard and removing all water-holding rubbish, including tyres and containers.
- Keeping your lawns mowed.
- Flushing and wiping out bird baths and water features once a week.
- Filling pot plant bases with sand to avoid standing water.
- Storing anything that can hold water undercover or in a dry place and keeping bins covered.
- Keeping drains and roof guttering clear to avoid standing water.
- Covering or securely screening the openings of septic tanks and rainwater tanks.
