While the Year 6 students were at Transition, the Year 5 students were busy polishing up there speeches for this terms Primary Assembly in Week 7.



Year Five/Six

David Tallon (Class Teacher)

In Mathematics, we have been learning about constructing 2D shapes using a compass, protractor and set squares. One lesson in particular was that students had to create a net of a 3D shape, cut it out and create the shape. The students enjoyed completing this task as it made them think about starting location on the paper, where to put the tabs for gluing, and how to construct the shapes with no templates. They did an amazing job!







In Literacy students have continued to learn skills to assist them gain a deeper meaning when reading texts such as referring back to their prediction and changing, using I wonder statements. This term has seen students write some wonderful character descriptions of their friends.





Term 4 – Week 2

Secondary News Mr Hocking (Head Teacher)

On Wednesday, the last of this year's Year 12 class completed her final HSC examination, bringing to an end 13 years of schooling. They have worked very hard, and should be proud of themselves for the effort that they've put in. However, the shark must keep swimming! Stage 5 exams have begun, and will be completed next week, before our secondary rollover begins and our Year 10s begin their transition to HSC in the final five weeks of the year. Next week, Mrs Morton and I will be taking the Stage 6 2017 students to Bendigo and Ballarat to visit a few tertiary institutions to help our students understand the opportunities that await them.

Year 7 and 8 examinations will begin next week, before their transitions to Years 8 and 9, respectively. As a result of the rollovers, our new secondary timetable will be in effect from Week 6, including electives and class changes.

Science

Miss McElevey (Science Teacher)

In Science throughout the semester Stage Four have been studying a variety of different topics and enjoying many different experiments.

Year Seven have been learned all about forces and this week completed their practical assessment task. They had to investigate one element of what influences the dropping speed of a skydiver. There were many complications to overcome including model skydivers breaking, windy conditions and strings getting tangled. A very interesting experiment.

Year Eight have been exploring our changing earth. We have made honeycomb and toffee to represent Lava and Pumice stone. They have made their own fossils and had to dig them up. We have also been investigating human impact on erosion and have come up with ideas of their own on how to tackle the problem. It has been a very busy topic for Year Eight.

Mr Hocking (Science Teacher)

Stage 5 students have been studying motion and forces and developing an understanding of how these apply in everyday life, including in car safety.

Our Stage 6 students will begin their study of Biology from Week 6 of this term. This will be a challenging, but rewarding, subject for our students and will give them a greater insight into the workings of many different types of organisms.

WORK EXPERIENCE/WORK PLACEMENT:

Over the past few weeks students from Year 10, 11 and 12 have been busy completing Work Experience and Work Placements. Students have once again received positive reviews from their employers and have learnt valuable skills relating to the working world. In addition students undertaking VET Automotive, metals and Engineering and Hospitality have been able to learn practise and develop specific industry skills and competencies whilst working on the job. I once again thank all of the employers involved who generously give up valuable time to accommodate our students.

REMINDER

• YEAR 12 VICTORIAN TERTIARY ADMISSIONS CENTRE (VTAC) - timely applications closed on 29 September; applications can still be made, but now cost \$100.

This is the last newsletter for 2016. Best wishes to those of you who move into other forms of education in 2017, be it university, VET, an apprenticeship or traineeship, or into employment.

YEAR 12 AND VTAC -

- Late course applications can still be made, but now cost \$100 (till 4 Nov). After that applications cost \$130 (till 2 Dec). The payment deadline for most applicants is 19 December.
- Course preference changes can be made till 12 noon 20 December, except for the period 8

 21 November; they can also be made between Offer Rounds in January and February
- The **first Offer Round** of courses will be on 18 January, the second on 7 February. There will be three later rounds of offers as well
- You are advised to accept your first offer of a tertiary place. Most applicants will only receive one offer. Accepting an offer does not stop you from receiving a later offer for a course higher in your preference list.

WHERE CAN I GET ASSISTANCE DURING 'CHANGE OF PREFERENCE' WEEK? The week after you receive your ATAR is generally known as Change of Preference (COP) week (Mon 12 – noon on Tues 20 December). During this time tertiary institutions run **information sessions, COP Expos**, offer **phone assistance**, and will help you in any way they can. You can also obtain **assistance at school**. 
