Mr Tallon has introduced the learning pit and that shows how we are feeling during our learning in English and numeracy.

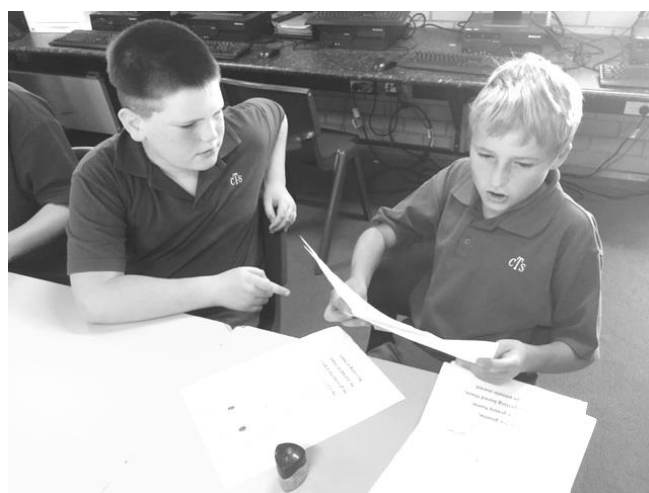

Watching the reunion of students and teachers, both past and present, reinforced to me the main reason I first became a teacher; to make a positive, lasting impression on people's lives through educational engagement. A big thank you to the high school students (particularly the S.R.C. students) who worked tirelessly throughout the day, assisting where they could. History

Leeta Rutherford (History Teacher)

Year 7/8 History

The students have finished exploring the historical context for their history study this year and have begun investigating the Vikings and will continue to do so until the middle of next term. This week they are starting their first assessment task for the Viking

unit which will be fully undertaken in class. Their second assessment task will be mainly undertaken at home which is creating trading cards for the Viking Gods and explorers. Students will be given this prior to the holidays so if they wish to undertake it at home during the holidays they can. It is not due until Week 4 next term.

Year 9/10 History

The students have undertaken a brief exploration into the historical context for their studies this year. They are now currently undertaking a core unit entitled 'Freedoms and Rights'. They are mainly concentrating on the freedoms and rights of Aboriginals in Australia, through this focus they are also getting an idea of the freedom and rights struggles in the United States of America and some other locations around the world throughout history.

As we are celebrating 100 Years of Education in Tooleybuc I thought it might be nice to learn a little about the very first teacher in Tooleybuc: Our first teacher was Mr Frank Smith. He was appointed in early April 1916 to the new Tooleybuc School at the age of 28 and came to Tooleybuc on his own. Mr Smith had been teaching since 1910. On May 11th 1916 the local newspaper 'Swan Hill Guardian and Lake Boga Advocate' stated that on average he was teaching around 19 students. On 27th May 1916 he joined up to fight in World War One in Swan Hill, however he continued teaching and running the Tooleybuc School until early June. On June 10th he enlisted in the Australian Imperial Force in Royal Park, Melbourne.

Mr Smith underwent training and left Australia for the war on board the 'HMAT Nestor' on October 2nd 1916 from Melbourne. He was in the 21st Battalion at this stage.

This is the unit Mr Smith went off to war with. The photo was taken at the wharf on the day they left. (Photograph taken from the Australian War Memorial).

While fighting during World War One on the Western Front he served in the following battalions – 21st Battalion (28/8/16 – 27/9/18); 22nd Battalion (28/9/18 – 16/10/18), 6th Battalion (17/10/18 – 20/11/18) and then finally the 24th Battalion (21/11/18 – 19/4/1919). He was wounded on October 4th 1917 near Ypers, Belgium.

While in England towards the end of the war he met and married his wife Gertrude Ingham on June 24th 1918 in Farnley, Yorkshire.

Mr Smith returned to Australia in 1919 and was discharged from the Army on October 4th 1919. He then continued teaching in New South Wales. He taught at various schools throughout New South Wales, eventually ending up in Culcairn where he remained until he died on July 29th 1971 at the age of 83.

Geography

Mark Nelson (Geography Teacher)

Year 7 and Year 8 have finished the Polar Regions topic and have moved on to Rainforests. They are learning about what makes these areas special and how they are important to all life on earth.

Year 9 and 10

Year 9 and 10 are looking at communities in Australia and how important these communities are to the fabric of Australian life. We have also watched an old movie (from the 60s) called "They are a Weird Mob", which is the story of an Italian migrant and his difficulty when he arrives in Australia.

Visual Art

Mark Nelson (Visual Art Teacher)

The students have started off each lesson by doing still drawings. The drawings produced have allowed students to not only practise drawing, but to evaluate their drawings and improve on them. They have also worked through a more technical drawing booklet which has given them an insight to producing good quality drawing for other school projects.

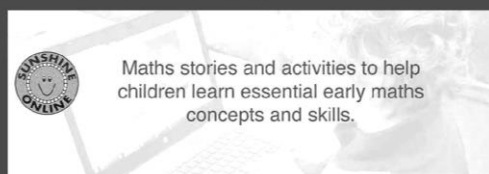
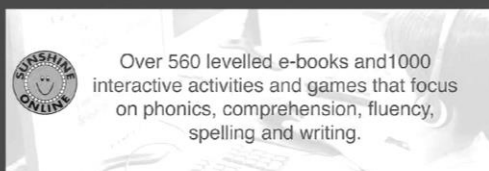
