
Uniform

Term 4 – Week 6

Primary News Mrs Frost (Assistant Principal)

It has once again been a busy few weeks at Tooleybuc Central School. Bluearth returned last week and all of the students enjoyed their mix of physical activity with a mindfulness focus.

In the Primary School all classes have continued to looked at the Friends program. Again the students appear to enjoy the stories and activities as part of this program and are all benefitting from developing their resilience skills.

On Monday we held our Whole School Transition Day. It was pleasing to see so many excited students as we all got a taste of what next year will look like.

There has also been a buzz of excitement among our Year 5 students in recent weeks too, as they prepare for their 'Young Leader' speeches for 2019. Those wishing to apply for the position presented their speeches at Friday's Primary Assembly. This is just part of the selection process as all applicants will also sit through an interview before the final voting takes place.

If you have been in the school recently I am sure you will have heard the strum of ukuleles and guitars coming from the Year 5/6 room. Most of the students have been practising hard both in class and at lunch time to be ready for their performance at Primary Assembly on Friday.

I'm sure there will be a lot of learning taking place in classes over the next two weeks as the end of the year seems to be coming very fast. It is important that all students attend regularly and get to school on time to make the most of the valuable learning time we have left.

Year 5/6

Mrs Frost (Class Teacher)

The Year 5/6 class has been studying poetry this term, they have been learning about a variety of poetry structures and poetic devices. Over the last two weeks we have been looking at the writing of Jackie French and her picture story books Cyclone, Fire and Flood. The students have been analysing her use of the poetic devices; in particular simile, metaphor and personification.

The students then brainstormed some descriptive language to describe a storm and wrote their own phrases using simile, metaphor or personification. As a group we produced the following poem.

Year 5/6 Collaborative Poem Storm:

As hot as the fire sparking, The lightning cracked like a stock whip, The fire was as hot as a boiling kettle, The sparking was a poppy as popcorn popping.

Secondary News Head Teachers Report Jean Duma (Head Teacher)

All students in Secondary have now started their new Academic Year, each having moved up a Year level. Stage 6 students had their Induction meeting on Monday and received the NESA HSC Rules and Procedures 2019, Preliminary/HSC Assessment Booklet 2018-2019, Stage 6 Homeroom & 'The Hub' Contract and Agreement, Lunch Pass note and a 2019 Term Calendar. Our Senior students are reminded that they are required to attend school on Mondays for all of their study lessons, accessing their class teachers when available and utilising 'The Hub' for completion of set class tasks, homework, assessment preparation and study.

TAS

David McCarron (TAS Teacher)

Year 8 Technology Mandatory - finished the semester designing Dragsters using a supplied technology kit. Some interesting and unusual designs resulted which were then raced over a 20 metre track to determine the fastest design. Going into race day Taylen was the hot favourite as her car in testing was very fast. However, as the students found out not all goes to plan on race day. Lyndon was crowned the winner with a simple design, while Amelia was a surprised runner up. Well done to all the student who made great cars. Students have now rolled over into stage five electives.

Year 9 Industrial Technology - Wood ended the semester making a simple, yet effective Beach Chair. As students ran out of time most of these remain uncompleted, however students will be given the opportunity to complete these projects before the end of the year. Students have now rolled over into year 10 and will start new projects this week.

Year 10 Industrial Technology - Wood ended the semester making a Adirondack chair. This project is also uncompleted as most student are affected by their TAFE commitments. It is yet to be determined if students are able to complete this project out of class time or take it home to complete. Students have now finished this course and will not return to a Industrial Technology subject until Term Four 2019.

Year 9/10 Agriculture spent the second half of the semester learning about beef cattle. Content from this unit was included in the Yearly Exam. Year 9 students have now rolled over into year 10 with a new unit to be started. Year 10 students have now completed Stage 5 Agriculture studies with many rolling over into VET Primary Industries.




