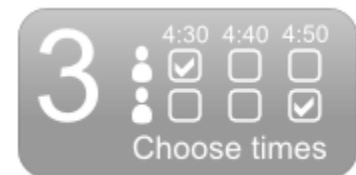
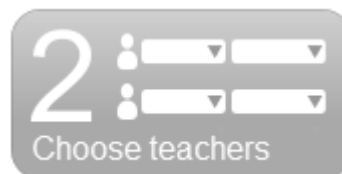

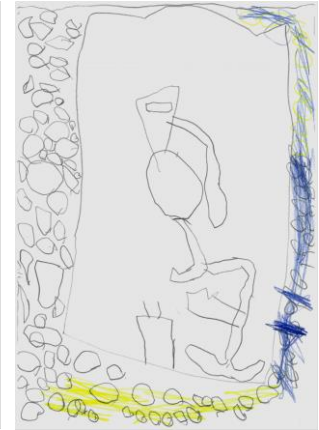
**Geography**

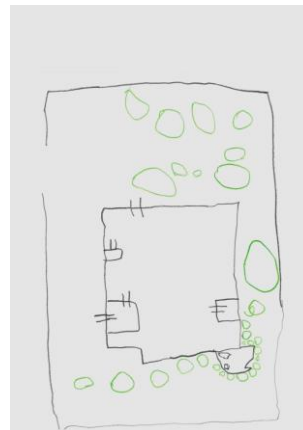
**Bird's eye view of Foundation Houses.**

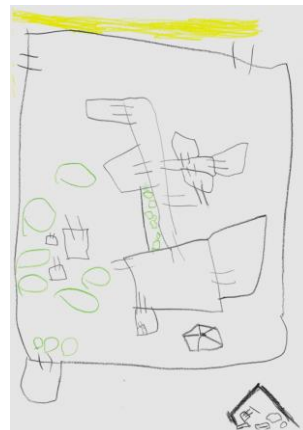

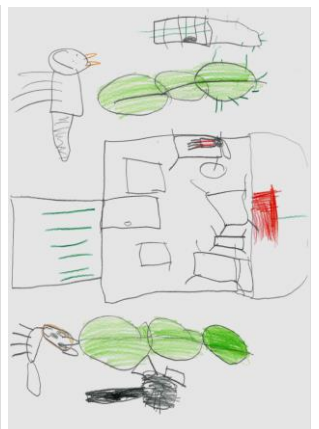

## Got It! Getting on Track in Time &

### TAG – Telehealth Approach to Got It! – Getting on Track in Time

#### The first part of the TAG/Got It! Program

**Got It! – Getting on Track in Time** is a two-part early intervention program rolling out in primary schools across NSW. This is a unique and exciting initiative for public primary schools supporting children's social and emotional development, behaviour and well-being. The first part of the program is a whole of school program called 'Fun FRIENDS' which includes professional development for all teachers in the social and emotional wellbeing of young people, and supports a whole of school intervention. Fun FRIENDS will also include whole of school community and carer workshops run during and after school hours. During next term there will also be weekly parenting tips and suggested resources shared via the school newsletter.

During the Got It! program all parents/carers will be asked to fill in a survey about their child called the Strengths and Difficulties Questionnaire (SDQ).

This part of the Got It! Program will be implemented by the Murrumbidgee Local Health District Got It! Team.

#### The second-part of the TAG/Got It! Program

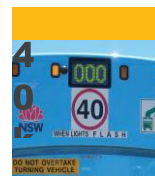
Some children and their parents/carers will then be invited to join the second part of the Got It! Program. This is when the research takes place. You can decide if you/your child want to take part in this second-part of the Got It! Program and research. You may be contacted by phone by a member of the Royal Far West research team.

The Royal Far West team will be working with families of children in Kindergarten to Year 2, (aged 4-8 years), who may be experiencing social or emotional difficulties or challenging and disruptive behaviour- at home or at school. The program will give families the opportunity to be part of a fun and supportive group that can improve child behaviour and family relationships and help parents deal with difficult behaviours. For some of these families this will include an 8 week group program.

Social and emotional difficulties or challenging behaviours may cause problems in many areas of a child's life. This can also be stressful for their family,

friends and community. Sadly, some children can be seen as 'naughty', rather than as children who are struggling with organising their thoughts, feelings and behaviours.

The TAG/Got It! and Royal Far West Program aims to provide support and practical help to children and their families, and also to support the school community to help children get the most out of the opportunities available to them



### Driving near buses

Bus lights flash on the front and back of a bus when the bus is picking up or setting down school children.

A 40km/h speed limit applies when bus lights flash. The speed limit is for all traffic travelling in the same direction as the bus, whether the bus is stationary or moving.

### Informal school bus stops

Informal bus stops are not sign posted and are usually found in rural areas. They may be at the front of a property or on the side of the road.

Drivers may find it difficult to see children at informal bus stops. Families should take special care when using these stops. Staying on the bus a bit longer to travel to another bus stop may reduce the need for your child to have to cross the road.

### HSIE

**Mark Nelson (Teacher)**

#### History - Stage 4

After finishing up studying the Vikings and making Viking trading card, students have been studying Japan under the shoguns. The students have been learning about the hierarchical systems of governing the Japanese people and about some of the unique

practises that they were performing like there managed forestry systems.

#### History - Stage 5

State 5 has moved on to studying about pop culture in Australia and what this has meant to the average person. They are now studying a decade in time and showing how the major events in fashion, food, and pop culture were influenced by worldwide events and how they changed Australia.

#### Geography - Stage 4

At present the stage 4 geography group is studying the interconnectedness of Australia and the world. This covers the advent of technology and how that has changed the way we view the world and how the world views us in return. We also have looked at world trade and its impact on Australia in terms of exports and imports as well as some of the broader issues of increased pollution and the growing gap between the rich and poor.

#### Geography - Stage 5

Stage 5 geography is studying wellbeing. This includes not only the wellbeing of an individual and the wellbeing of countries and regions of the world. Factors like literacy and education, availability of health services and types of technology can all be used to determine a countries general wellbeing.

**2 Encourage planning and goal-setting**  
Start with the big picture. Before diving into any activity – a maths problem or finding out about something in history, for example – take time to get the overview. With young children, show how this helps by, for example, looking at the lid of a jigsaw puzzle or the instructions that go with a game.

Picture what success will be like before starting a task. How will children know they have achieved it? Take time to talk about this with your child.

**Tips for looking ahead and setting goals**

- Encourage your child to close their eyes and picture the task in their head. You may also want to suggest they think of people they know who can do whatever it is they are planning.
- Ask questions that encourage looking ahead, such as: 'How long do you think this will take you?' and 'How will you know if you have learned these spellings?'
- Make a simple chart with your child that shows when they will do their homework and put it on their bedroom wall.

**ACTIVITY: Planning homework**  
This big-picture approach to a history task can easily be adapted for other homework.

Suppose your child has to read a passage from a book about Australian Aboriginals, then answer questions and draw an annotated cross-section of an eel trap. Before reading for information, they need to get the 'big picture' by following the four steps below.

- 1 Read the task to check they have everything they need:** the textbook opened at the right pages, a workbook or some paper, coloured pens and pencils
- 2 Make sure they understand the task.** Use a dictionary or get them to ask a family member if they don't know what 'annotated' or 'cross-section' means
- 3 Read the questions quickly.** This will help them to focus on what is important when they come to check the text for detail.
- 4 'Scan' the text to get the general meaning:** to scan the text look at titles, subheadings and the first few sentences of each paragraph.

**Goal-setting**  
When your child has finished planning, help them to set targets and think about what success will feel like. In the activity above, their goals might be: 'I'll take 15 minutes to read the passage, then answer the first five questions, then take a break. I'll try and write at least three sentences for each answer. I'll finish this by 7.00 p.m. and then do another 40 minutes tomorrow.'

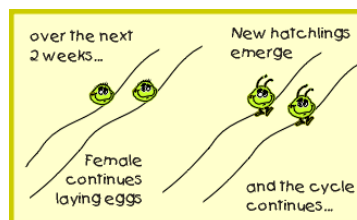
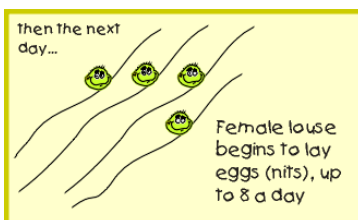
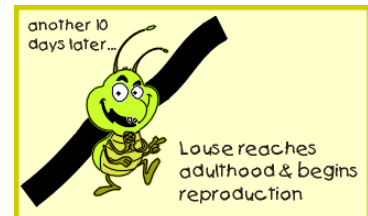
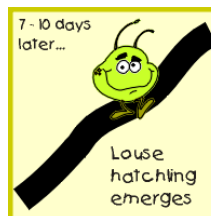
Use the holiday to be vigilant and break the cycle.
