
#### The Brain Man

#### Primary News Assistant Principal Louisa Frost (Assistant Principal)

It has been wonderful to walk around the school since the start of term and hear all the students enthusiastically rehearsing for Performance Night. This night will be a fantastic show case of the creative arts programs we have at school and I look forward to seeing you all there.

You may have heard in the media this week that today many schools around the country celebrated 'Day for Daniel.' 'Day for Daniel' is an iniative of the Daniel Morcombe Foundation. This foundation has been set up by Daniel Morcombe's parents and it is their aim to hold Australia's Biggest Child Safety Lesson. The objective of this lesson is to teach all students how:

- To **recognise** safe and unsafe situations and safety clues.
- To react to keep ourselves safe.
- To report unsafe situations.

Over a 4 week period all students from Foundation to Year 10 will be participating in age appropriate lessons, taken from the Daniel Morcombe Foundation website or from the Department of Education NSW Child Protection syllabus documents. We will then hold our own 'Day for Daniel' to raise funds to donate back to the foundation.

## Year One/Two

#### Emma Gentle (Year 1-2 Teacher)

This week students have been writing descriptions. As we are looking at Australia this term, we have been looking at different Australian landscapes. I was very proud of the sentences that the children wrote as they were very descriptive without using too many words. We have been speaking about the choice an author makes when choosing words to use when writing. The correct word choice can result in painting an accurate 'picture' in the reader's head. For this activity, students were shown an image of The Simpson Desert and they were to brainstorm the nouns in the picture and write down verbs and adjectives that match the nouns. From this, they then created their descriptive sentence about the image.



## Mandatory Technology

**David McCarron (Technology Mandatory Teacher)** Year 7 Technology Mandatory - have been busy learning about control technology in their current unit "Crack the Code". Students have been completing Plug Run Play activities using a microcontroller. The microcontrollers are attached to a ThinkerShield which contains a variety of on-board components to make it easy to learn how to "code" without having to learn how to do electronics. Most households would contain items which have microcontrollers that have been coded. A common example is your TV remote.

#### Mark Nelson (Technology Mandatory Teacher)

Year 8 TAS have been following a unit called Cultural Foods. This unit allows to look at another culture and learn about the makeup of that culture, what customs they have and what foods they eat and then compares it to our own culture. The students selected and cooked a dish from that culture. These ranged from Tacos, Greek Yogurt Cheesecake to Warm German Potato Salad to name some of the dishes.

This term we are concentrating on Australian culture and asking similar question to what we did in our previous culture. We have started this term by cooking Pink Lamingtons and next we will do Golden Syrup Dumplings.

Oats the students sowed earlier in the year have been cut for hay. Production was lower than anticipated due to the persistent dry conditions. Most of our sheep and lambs have been offloaded to the saleyards with new stock to arrive in the near future.

Year 12 Primary Industries students finished off last term with a successful second mandatory work placement. All students received favourable reports. These students have now completed the course and sat their HSC examination. Most students were able to satisfy the requirements to achieve a Certificate II in Agriculture qualification.
