Year 3-4 with Miss Sherlock & Miss gentle

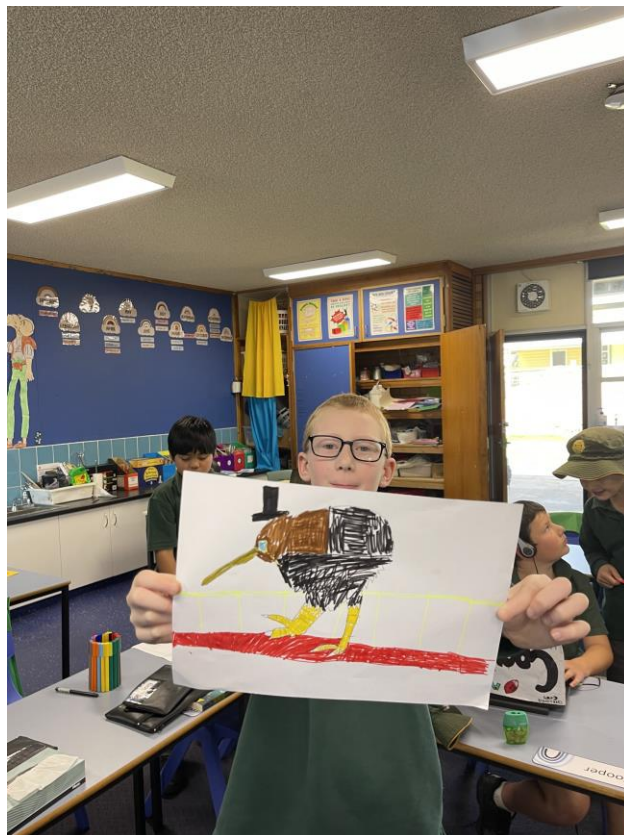

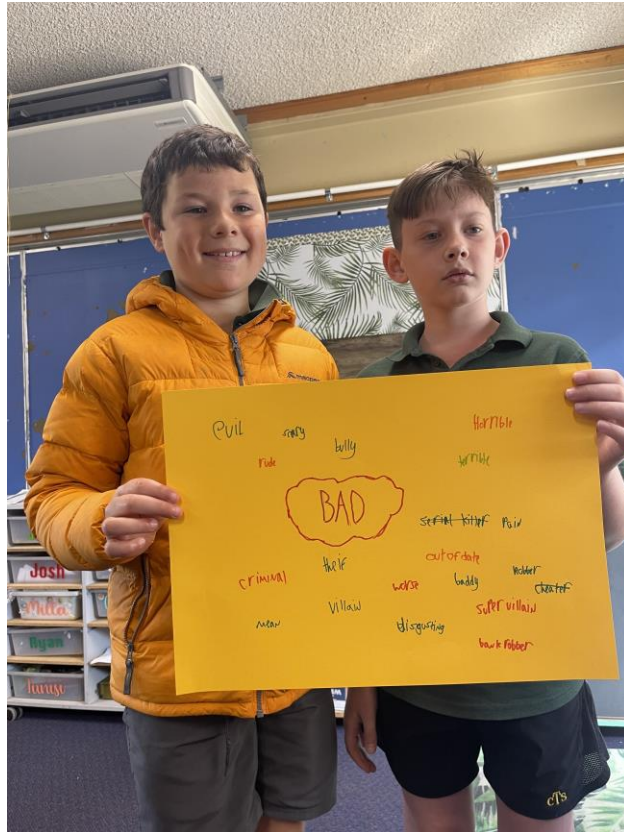
