

Hello to all students and parents. This year I am delivering Career Education to Year 8-10 students and assisting Year 11-12 with their career planning. We were successful in obtaining additional career funding this year to support careers over all year levels so I look forward to helping to organise some great career related events. I am also teaching Food Technology to Year 9-10 and TAS Food to Year 7-8 students, with Year 7's in Term 1 & 2, Year 8's in Term 3 & 4. Once again the focus shall be on students developing independent skills when working in a kitchen.

Hi everyone! Stage One have settled in and begun completing some wonderful learning. As part of one of our new English units that come along with the new syllabus, Stage One students created a class book based on the book Under the Southern Cross by Frane' Lessac. Each student used oil pastels and a paint wash to create an artwork of their favourite places in Australia. Students then typed their sentences and attached them to their artworks.

During Mathematics we have been diving into the new syllabus and have explored whole numbers, patterns, and shapes. The students have enjoyed participating in the hands-on activities to consolidate their knowledge.

We have also had a focus on respectful relationships and working together during PE, students have enjoyed using teamwork to complete activities and games, and altering them to be more inclusive.

I am loving getting to know all the students and can't wait to see all the wonderful learning the students complete throughout the rest of the term.

Stage 6: Sport, Lifestyle & Recreation – since the commencement of the school year students have studied the sports of badminton and bocce and are currently learning about cricket including its unique fielding positions, rules and terminology.

Stage 5: Child Studies – after completing the learning topic on inclusion and responding to diversity students are now learning about the role media and technology play in the development of young children.

In Stage Four this term, students have been learning about identity and healthy relationships. They are making good connections with the content and will soon be looking at good communication skills and puberty.

In Stage Five this term, students have looked at the difference between physical activity and physical exercise. They have compared their levels of physical activity, to those of the National Guidelines (which say you should be doing 60min of moderate to vigorous activity per day)

In practical lessons, they have also started on Athletics and showing some true potential.

Stage 5 PASS

In PASS, students have begun looking at the different body systems. They have looked at the skeletal and muscular system so far and how they interact with each other. They will be going into more detail with these systems and looking at the various movements we perform in every-day life.

During practical lessons, they have begun the lacrosse unit and are picking it up extremely well. They are working well as a team and are always having a go, which is great to see.

Students have completed Core 3, Families and Communities, and are starting on Individuals and Groups. They are working well as a class and progressing smoothly through the content.
